PUBLIC HEARING - IMPACT FEE REVIEW

Wilbur Dean, County Coordinator

Presenting the Impact Fee Review Hearing 2019-001 for applicant Steven Crews to the Board. Pursuant to Section 47.120 of the Levy County Code of Ordinances, Steven Crews requests a review hearing before the Board regarding Road and EMS Impact Fees in the total amount of \$6,165.

Atty. Brown administered swearing in of audience for any of the following three (3) Public Hearing items.

Comm. John Meeks asked if there was any ex-parte. Ex-parte communication concerning the Impact Fee Review Hearing was declared by Comm. Rooks, Comm. Rock Meeks, and Comm. John Meeks.

Evan Rosenthal representing Nabors, Giblin & Nickerson spoke to the Board concerning the request by the applicant Mr. Crews. Mr. Rosenthal requested the Board deny Mr. Crews' request to waive the Road and EMS Impact Fees.

Applicant Steven Crews then spoke to the Board expressing concerns of a difference in the amount he was quoted previously for the amount he would be responsible for concerning impact fees.

Bill Hammond spoke regarding the amount quoted to Mr. Crews, stating the amount previously given was before final plans were submitted and was an estimate based on what Mr. Crews stated at the time.

ROAD DEPARTMENT

A. Requesting Board approval of Resolution 2019-001 to support the Agreement for C32 Sidewalk Project and approve Alice LaLonde executing the Agreement in electronic format.

Comm. Joyner made a motion to approve Resolution 2019-001 as requested. Second was made by Comm. Rooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

B. Requesting Board approval of Resolution 2019-002 authorizing the execution of a Transportation Alternative Program Application with FDOT for a feasibility study for a bike path on C40.

Comm. Rooks made a motion to approve Resolution 2019-002 as requested. Second was made by Comm. Rock Meeks and the MOTION CARRIES.

C. Discussion on NW 110th Street (LCR 201) survey and construction for the developers of Strawberry Fields RV Park. Mrs. LaLonde stated it is her suggestion for the Levy County Road Department to straighten the portion of the road to follow the existing survey markers and to approach the developers regarding the hiring of a private contractor to pave the 2,000 ft. of roadway alongside the RV Park.

The Board agreed by consensus to move forward with the Road Department straightening the road and approaching the developers about hiring a private contractor to pave the 2,000 ft. of roadway alongside the RV Park as suggested by Mrs. LaLonde.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

John MacDonald, Director

Requesting approval and signature by the Board on Sub-grant Modification Z0355-5, which increases funding from the original contract by \$9,458.04.

Comm. Rooks made a motion to approve with the Chairman's signature Sub-grant Modification Z0355-5 as requested. Second was made by Comm. Rock Meeks and the MOTION CARRIES.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Merritt stated the South Levy Marketplace will take place on Saturday, January 26th.

Terry Witt asked if the Board voted to change the meeting times for the meetings following a Monday Holiday. Mr. Dean stated this was done when they adopted the meeting schedule and Comm. John Meeks offered to provide Mr. Witt with a copy.

Linda Cooper asked when an update would be given on the new building at Animal Services. Comm. Rooks responded an update would be given at an upcoming meeting.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Comm. Brooks stated he will be continuing the Florida Association of County's Education for Advanced County Commissioner Training this Thursday and Friday in Gainesville. Comm. Brooks stated he will be in Tallahassee on January 16th for a Rural Economic Development Academy. On Saturday, January 19th, the Ministerial Faith Alliance has sent an invitation to everyone for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Parade in Williston which will begin at 10:00 A.M. ending at Cornelius Williams Funeral Home where a service will follow at 11:00 A.M. Comm. Brooks stated the 6:30 P.M. Black Tie Gala will be held at the Williston Middle/High School.

Comm. Rock Meeks spoke Florida's Amendment 1, regarding the use of Conservation Funds to purchase a certain amount of properties. He stated there is a group, "Florida Forever" looking to purchase some properties, one of which lies within Levy County. Comm. Rock Meeks expressed concerns if this purchase is made stating the property would no longer be on the Tax Roll.

Mr. Dean stated this purchase would only affect the potential revenue for development as only the development rights would be sold. The taxes for the land itself would still be collectable.

Comm. John Meeks stated the next meeting of the Board of County Commissioners will be on January 22nd at 6:00 P.M. Comm. John Meeks state other night meetings will be on the ones following President's Day, February 19th, Memorial Day and Labor Day.
